

Transforming Your City-Marketplace Ministries Course Description & Syllabus

This Leadership and Spiritual Formation course covers a thorough introduction to Ministry in the Marketplace along with ways one can engage in Marketplace Leadership. This course will review in depth how today's leaders can obtain a better understanding and deeper knowledge of the three Gates of Influence that we, as Christian leaders, must be present and active in. Through lectures and relevant information that applies to ministry today, the student can be better equipped to expand and influence their territory for the cause for Christ in the Marketplace. This course can be taken on an undergraduate level of study (TYC-111 - toward a Bachelors degree), or it can be taken on a graduate level of study (TYC-511/TYC-711 - toward a Masters or Doctors degree), providing the course requirements are met as explained in this course syllabus.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

<u>ACADEMIC</u>--- To obtain a better understanding and deeper knowledge of the three Gates of Influence that are outlined Biblically for Christian leaders.

<u>ATTITUDINAL</u>---To help the student understand the concept of Marketplace Ministries and how this relates to intentional ministry outside the four walls of the Church.

<u>BEHAVIORAL</u>--- To empower today's student and leaders with intentional ways to enhance their leadership ability as a Marketplace Minister and leader.



COURSE GRADING:

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The textbook is Supplemental; not required for the Online Student but available to the Online Student as a supplement to expand their learning.

TYC-111 - (DIPLOMA – ASSOCIATE - BACHELOR) – 3 CREDIT - DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

For Students taking this course at an undergraduate level, (4) credit course, an additional six (6)-page essay is required to be submitted from a selected topic of choice applicable to the coursework in addition to the criteria below. This six (6)-page essay includes a cover page & bibliography page. The essay is to be typed double spaced, in New Times Roman type font, 12 font size. Coursework may be electronically uploaded into the Online Student Portal (if taking the course as an Online Student); submitted to the overseeing Instructor (if taking the course as part of a Distance Learning (DLC) Center); or electronically emailed to <u>Assignment@chesapeakebiblecollege.com</u>.

- 1. Maintain a minimum of a "C" average for the course.

- 4. Complete the assigned quizzes.
- 5. Before taking the final examination, the student will select from one (1) Lesson Topic of Choice and submit a one (1) page summary on how they have or will apply the concept of learning into their efforts outside of the local church. The summary submitted must have course title page, be submitted as outlined in the TYC-111 Degree Requirement description above and will count toward one-half (50%) of your course grade.
- 6. Successful completion of the Mid-term (25%) and Final (25%) Examinations will constitute the remainder of your grades for the course.

TYC-511 - (MASTERS) – 4 CREDIT - DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

For students taking this course on a Master's level, the student must:

- 1. Maintain a minimum of a "B" average for the course.

- 4. Complete the assigned quizzes.
- 5. Before taking the final examination, the student will submit a ten (10)- page essay on any topic pertaining to the subject studied in this course. The instructions for essay/assignment submission are as follows: Coursework may be electronically uploaded into the Online Student Portal (if taking the course as an Online Student); submitted to the overseeing Instructor (if taking the course as part of a Distance Learning (DLC) Center); or electronically emailed to <u>Assignment@chesapeakebiblecollege.com</u>. The essay will constitute one-half (50%) of your grade for the course.
- 6. Successful completion of the Mid-term (25%) and Final (25%) Examinations will constitute the remainder of your grades for the course.

TYC-711 - (DOCTORS) – 4 CREDIT - DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

For students taking this course on a Doctor's level, the requirements are the same as the Masters degree (seen above) except the student must write a twenty (20)-page essay, instead of a ten (10)- page essay. This twenty (20)-page essay includes a cover page & bibliography page. The essay may be submitted as outlined in the TYC-511 Degree Requirement and the Masters Degree descriptions above.
