TYC116 - (DIPLOMA – ASSOCIATE - BACHELOR) – 3 CREDIT - DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

This six (6)-page essay includes a cover page & bibliography page. The essay is to be typed double spaced, in New Times Roman type font, 12 font size. The instructions for essay/assignment submission are as follows: Coursework may be electronically uploaded into the Online Student Portal (if taking the course as an Online Student); submitted to the overseeing Instructor (if taking the course as part of a Distance Learning (DLC) Center); or electronically emailed to Assignment@chesapeakebiblecollege.com.

4. Healing through Deliverance; Peter Horrobin, Sovereign World 2008

Horrobin was raised Christian, non-denominational, and came into ministry later in life by challenge from God. **This book is highly recommended and in Dr. Torre's opinion, a must have** for its foundational, comprehensive, Biblical, and practical teaching on the enemy and deliverance. Covers topics not included in many other books on the subject. Scripturally based and notated with plenty of examples of application.

Unbound: A Practical Guide to Deliverance; Neal Lozano, Chosen Books 2003

Lozano comes from a Catholic background but in 1970 he had some spiritual encounter that changed his life. Given the time frame and what was going on in the Catholic Church at that time, I believe he encountered the charismatic renewal the baptism of the Holy Spirit. What also leads me to this conclusion are his comments and those he asked to make recommendations in his book; Bert Ghezzi, Mike Scanlon; both big names in the charismatic renewal at that time. He's also taking information from other non-Catholic streams so there are comments from John Sanford from Elijah House; Carol Wimber from the Vineyard; and he's also using in his appendix MacNutt's questionnaire on the occult.

Lozano's focus seems to be on what he is calling the 5 Keys: 1 repent, 2 forgive, 3 renounce in the name of Jesus, 4 take authority in the name of Jesus, and 5 received the Father's blessing. Though the casting out of the demon seems to be missing here, when you read his examples of deliverance that he's been involved with, he is doing casting out as part of the deliverance process. He had some good information on what not to do when you're doing deliverance, mistakes to avoid, and his incorporation of Pablo Bottari's 10 steps of deliverance that you'll read about in one of the other books being recommended.

Free in Christ - Your Complete Handbook on the Ministry of Deliverance; Pablo Bottari, Charisma House, 2000

Like so many others, Pablo was not initially bound for ministry and became a pastor as a result of his experience with deliverance. He was a barber, born in Italy, moved to Argentina, and became involved in helping at crusades, his church was holding. Initially not gifted with the traditional evidence of the Holy Spirit nor Pentecostal, nevertheless, his other qualities of love, patience, humility were noticed and he was put in charge of the deliverance tent. Not knowing what to do, he let Christ lead him and teach him. This book is the very helpful result of his years of ministry, what he learned to do and not to do. He offers 10 Steps of Deliverance, divided into three specific sections, and a helpful question and answer chapter.

Pigs in the Parlor - A Practical Guide to Deliverance; Frank & Ida Mae Hammond, Impact Books, 1973

Baptist minister from Texas, seminary trained, experienced the Baptism of the Holy Spirit and their ministry took on this new direction. Influenced by Derek Prince, and as you might expect from a good Baptist, much scripture is quoted and expounded on in light of his new experiences with deliverance. Touches on subjects like how demons enter, how to retain your deliverance, demons and children, mental health issues, spiritual warfare, self deliverance, and the groupings of demons often seen together in a person. Very practical in setting up the ministry time, who should be involved and what they should do. Much of what came after 1973 was influenced by this book.

They Shall Expel Demons - What you need to know about Demons - your Invisible Enemies; Derek Prince, Chosen Books, 1998

Thirty years of personal experience, practical and comprehensive, biblically based. He offers advice on how to receive and minister deliverance. This book discusses his teaching about 9 activities of demons, 7 ways they gain access, and then offers 9 steps to deliverance. He was an International Bible teacher, theologian, Pentecostal, founding member of the Shepherding Movement, author of over 100 books, hundreds of videos, and thousands of articles. He hosted a daily radio program broadcast in many countries. His work on demonization is mentioned in quite a number of the books of others on this topic.

ADDITIONAL REFERENCE MATERIALS

These books are from a variety of denominations and theological perspectives. This is by no means an exhaustive list on the topic of demons or deliverance. Dr. Torre is not endorsing any of these books directly but lists them here as possible helps to understanding the enemy's plans, our subsequent deliverance, and how it is done across the broader Christian church. You will agree with some, disagree with others. All of them will help you hone what you believe and how your church will do deliverance. Read with discernment, wrestle with the information they present, listen to what the Holy Spirit reveals as you read.
